



















THE ISSUES IN NATIONAL SECURITY (INS) LECTURES are

designed to offer scholarly lectures to the spouses, partners, and significant others of our students; military/civilian employees assigned to the Naval War College and Naval Station Newport and its tenant activities; Foundation members; and local-area retirees or active/reserve personnel.

Participation is voluntary (no reading or writing assignments). In previous years these lectures were presented live in Pringle Auditorium. Due to the COVID-19 crisis, however, these lectures will be conducted on-line using the Zoom conferencing system. Live lectures may be reinstated when conditions permit.

Lectures will he held approximately every other week on Tuesday afternoons from 4:30 to 5:35 pm (followed by a 30-minute Discussion Group for those interested).

There will be 18 lectures during from September 2020 through May 2021. A link to the Zoom sessions will be posted by the Public Affairs Office one day prior to each lecture. These lectures are being offered to provide intellectual stimulation to the participants, and no formal academic credit will be awarded.
