Graduate Certificate in Ethics and Emerging Military Technology

The Graduate Certificate in Ethics and Emerging Military Technology (EEMT) is a specialized elective track for students seeking to deepen their expertise in the ethical complexities imposed by new technology. Students are given priority enrollment for EEMT-related electives and will develop and produce a well-researched, faculty-mentored professional paper on the nexus between ethics and emerging technology.

Eligibility

• This graduate certificate program is available for resident students, civilian federal employees (GS14-GS15, or equivalent), and international students who have been selected for the International Master of Arts Program.

Location & Duration

• This 10-month specialized elective track is completed in conjunction with the College of Naval Warfare curriculum. Students are taught at U.S. Naval War College (NWC) in Newport, Rhode Island.

Learning Format

• Courses are conducted in seminar format. Students also complete a faculty-mentored professional paper during the academic year.

Outcome

• Students in this specialized program are awarded a certificate, along with four additional graduate credits. In addition, students will develop and produce a well-researched, faculty-mentored professional paper on an original topic of their choice concerning the nexus between ethics and emerging technology.

General Program Overview

Professional Paper | Ongoing, Required Complete a high quality, faculty mentored, professional paper on a selected topic of ethics and technology.

Course Requirement | Student Selected Elective, Required Students are required to take "EL 730 Ethics of Technology" course in the Fall.

Electives in Ethics and Technology Concentration | Student Selected Elective, Required Students must enroll in two electives pertaining to ethics and technology concentration.
