Graduate Certificate in Ethics and Emerging Military Technology

The Graduate Certificate in Ethics and Emerging Military Technology (EEMT) is a specialized elective track for students seeking to deepen their expertise in the ethical complexities imposed by new technology. Students are given priority enrollment for EEMT-related electives and will develop and produce a well-researched, faculty-mentored professional paper on the nexus between ethics and emerging technology.

Eligibility

This graduate certificate program is available for resident students, civilian federal employees (GS13, or equivalent), and
international students who have been selected for the International Master of Arts Program.

Location & Duration

This 10-month specialized elective track is completed in conjunction with the College of Naval Warfare curriculum.
 Students are taught at U.S. Naval War College (NWC) in Newport, Rhode Island.

Learning Format

Courses are conducted in seminar format. Students also complete a faculty-mentored professional paper during the
academic year.

Outcome

 Students in this specialized program are awarded a certificate, along with four additional graduate credits. In addition, students will develop and produce a well-researched, faculty-mentored professional paper on an original topic of their choice concerning the nexus between ethics and emerging technology.

General Program Overview

Professional Paper | Ongoing, Required

Complete a high quality, faculty mentored, professional paper on a selected topic of ethics and technology.

Course Requirement | Student Selected Elective, Required

Students are required to take "EL 730 Ethics of Technology" course in the Fall.

Electives in Ethics and Technology Concentration | Student Selected Elective, Required Students must enroll in two electives pertaining to ethics and technology concentration.
